

Dear Mayor Cranley, City Council Members, Manager Duhaney, Commissioner Moore, Chief Winston and Directors Denning, Betts, Bailey and Kish,

As you know, our dozens of organizations have been coordinating daily to strategize and implement action to mitigate the threat of an outbreak of COVID-19 among individuals and families with children experiencing homelessness. In this, we have collaborated with the City of Cincinnati, Hamilton County, United Way of Greater Cincinnati and the Greater Cincinnati Foundation.

All of this has resulted in the establishment of a quarantine shelter for single adults experiencing homelessness who have been tested for COVID-19 and the movement of approximately 371 people from shelters to hotel rooms. This accounts for approximately 43 percent of the people in shelter prior to the pandemic. This week we will be moving at least 25 to 50 more people out of shelter and into hotel. While more hotel rooms and the funding to pay for them is still needed, this movement creates more opportunity for social distancing among people who are still in shelters.

Collectively, we have identified an important problem in need of intervention from the city. The number of people experiencing homelessness outdoors is significantly and quickly increasing. As a result of the pandemic, this growing number of people have very little and in some cases no access to drinking water and water to clean hands and no one in this situation can access a shower or laundry. We need to city to step in and provide for these basic needs to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Our hospitality members have converted their typical daily meal services to boxed meals available for pickup at their facility doors. As a result of this pandemic and the economic and access consequences of the wise decisions to close businesses, these organizations have seen a very significant increase in the number of people in need of meals. On 03-24-2020 Our Daily Bread served 164 lunch meals, on 04-07-2020 they served 350 lunch meals, 113 percent more. While numbers of meals fluctuate daily, they are staying consistent at approximately double where they were before the pandemic. Nearby, St. Francis Seraph Ministries (SFSM) is serving at least 250 breakfast and dinner meals. SFSM reports that typically their numbers would decrease this time of the month, but instead are steadily climbing. Our hospitality organizations, street outreach workers and other service providers are reporting very significant increases in the number of people living outdoors.

Our Daily Bread and Mary Magdalene House have set up a port-o-let with hand washing capabilities outside of both of their facilities. Last Friday, 04-03-2020, Greater Cincinnati Water Works set up two clean water spigots outside of Our Daily Bread for folks nearby to be able to access drinking water. While these provisions are steps forward, they can only meet *some* of the basic needs of *some* of the people living outdoors who are within the vicinity of these two close locations.

Therefore, because public restrooms have been closed, water fountains turned off and facilities have had to close, the significantly increasing number of people experiencing homelessness outdoors in our city have little and in some cases, no access to restrooms, water to drink or water to clean their hands. Nobody living outdoors has access to showers or to launder their clothes. While we understand the reason for turning off water fountains and some of the other limitations, we know that people have to be able to drink, clean their hands, their bodies and their clothes. These are, of course, basic needs all of the time, but are of even greater importance as we attempt to prevent illnesses and the spread of COVID-19.

Without access to clean water to drink and clean oneself with, the threat of **scabies**, **Hepatitis A**, **trench-foot**, various **infections** and especially **COVID-19** increases exponentially. To provide for these most **basic of life-saving needs**, we need the City of Cincinnati to step in. We are calling on the City to finance and ensure placement and service of the following in public locations throughout the city:

- Port-o-lets or restrooms with hand-washing capabilities.
- Hand-washing stations with soap and water.
- Clean drinking water spigots for filling containers.
- Shower trucks with soap and shampoo.
- Laundry facility for cleaning of clothing.

This is an immediate need, that if provided will help to **curb the spread of COVID-19**, especially as we are all hearing that soon the number of cases of the virus will increase. We know these are necessary to **prevent outbreak among people experiencing homelessness**, to decrease spread throughout our City and ultimately **save lives**. We also understand that there is a **relatively low monthly cost** associated with renting most of these serviced items.

We, the undersigned present this immediate need and are **ready to have conversation** with city staff about where these provisions should be placed geographically.
