Strategic Planning Process (Starting March 1st)

- Flesh out specific metrics for objectives and sub-goals
- Create the necessary fundraising plan
- Establish MARCC's Theory of Change

Committee Formation


- Committees will begin meeting on March 1st: Join Now!

Committees as Sites of Research-Action

Research-Action: a dialogic process that explores research questions that emerge from those affected most by a particular social problem with the goal of contributing to solutions to those problems

Toward a Theory of Change (1)

<u>Theory</u>: a systematic explanation of a quantity of empirical data

Theory of Change: a systematic explanation of how change happens based on data (not necessarily just how we'd like it to happen)

Toward a Theory of Change (2)

How does social change actually happen?

What kind of change do we want to see?

How can MARCC make the kind of change we want to see?

What strategies should we use?

How should we engage with power-holders and policy-makers?

Possible Research-Action Questions on Affordable Housing

What is affordable housing anyway?

- Why is there a shortage of affordable housing in the Cincy area?
- What factors cause people and families to face eviction?

What has been successful across the country in making progress on affordable housing?
